WITNESS WANTED IN BIG SUIT FOUND HERE.

H. Helberg Gives Testimony in Ac- sca-le tion Between Standard and Eagle Oil.

The Standard Oil Company, having purened H. Helberg, an important witness in a lawsuit, for 15 months, it is said, finally located him in Portland several ago and for the five days just passed has had him before a notary pubic taking his deposition.

Heiberg, who is a young German, was formerly in the employ of the Eagle Off Company of Hamburg, which is in league with the independent oil manufacturers of the United States, and having been taken with the "American fever," came to this country several years ago and has since then wandered from place to place, readily obtaining employment everywhere as an oll-mixer, and was serving in that ca-placity for Fisher, Thorsen & Co. and Rasmussen & Co., local oil jobbing houses, when located by the Standard Oil representatives. He had at one time worked in one of the Standard Oil refineries, and on account of his former connection with the Standard Oil's rivals was believed to be something in the na-ture of a spy. Nothing to this purpose, however, was proved in the deposition

just taken.

The Standard Oil Company believed that he would be an important witness in a case for four years pending in the United States Circuit Court for the District of New Jersey, in which the Standard Oil Company is suing the Eagle Oil Company and various independent American oil manufacturers "to restrain alleged un-fair competition and infringement of the ollowing alleged trademarks, 'Vacuum,' Arctic,' 'Etna,' 'Viscolite' and 'Electra.' " 'his suit was brought in this country, it following alleged trademarks, is said, because similar sults of this nature natituted in European countries had re-sulted in a protecting decree for the Eagle Off Company.

Heiberg, in his deposition testified that from his knowledge the Eagle Off Com-pany was in the habit of selling its brands of oil as "just as good as" certain Stan-dard Oil brands, but had never stolen trademarks, that the Eagle Oil Company always sold by sample to the jobbing-houses and not directly to the trade, as the Standard Oil does; and that the Eagle On Company in Europe sells its products

of equal grade with the Standard Oil Company for one-tenth the price. The Standard Oil Company once ran advertisements in the big European papers discisiming all connection with the Eagle Oll Company, Heiberg testified, and from that time on the business of the Eagle

Oll Company grew wonderfully.

The "vacuum" process of refining oil came largely into question in the deposition, one of the alleged infringements be-ing in regard to this. Helberg testified that from his observations in the Standard Oil refinery in which he worked, the Standard Oil Company's processes were no different from those used by any other manufacturers and that the "vacuum" profess was the only safe way of per-forming a certain portion of the work. As to any infringement of the word "vacuum" as a trademark, Helberg says

The deposition was taken in Portland before Cecil H. Bauer, as notary, the Eagle Oil Company being represented by Charles J. Schnabel and the Standard Oil Company by Chamberlain & Thomas. The latter were also assisted by Standard Oil representatives from San Francisco. A great part of the evidence was obsected to by Mr. Schnabel on the ground that the United States courts had no jurisdiction over alleged infringements of trademark laws in Germany.

Helberg was summoned to appear be-fore a notary public here by order of the United States Circuit Court.
