WHAT SOO CANAL HAS DONE

### Developed Commerce Greater Than

That of Suez Canal.

SAULT STE. MARIE, Mich., Aug. 2-The Sault Ste. Marie ship canal, the 10th anniversary of the opening of which was celebrated today, was completed by the State of Michigan in 1855. This ship channel, which is a connecting link between Lake Superior and the lower lakes, was transferred to the Government in 1870. ace the Government took charge of the waterway, vast improvements have been undertaken, the canal having been widened and deepened several times. It is now considered the busiest of the world's artificial waterways. In 1808, the lock erected by this state was destroyed by excavations for the present Poe lock, which is the largest in the world. It is 800 feet long and 100 feet wide, with a water depth of 22 feet on the sills.

The Weitzei lock, which was made necstill in operation, is 515 feet long. The traffic by way of the Soo Canal, both American and Canadian, during 1904 was \$2,000,000 net tons, 27,000,000 of which were through the American canal. The traffic of the Suez Canal in 1904 was 22,-600,000 net tons. This represented a large part of the commerce of Europe, Asia and some of that be ween the United States and Asia. The 1 so Canal has developed the vast mineral wealth of the Lake Superior region, and has furnished a cheap and convenient outlet for the transportation of grain, flour and other products to the East and to Europe. It has helped to build up great industrial centers at Detroit, Cleveland and Buffalo, us aided in making Pittsburg the great est iron and steel center in the world and has contributed materially towards giving the United States primary in the production of Iron, steel and copper.
