Unfor-tunately for New York, however, no charge can be made for the baths under the arrangement by which its extensive and generous free public bath system has been installed. Recourse can only be had to the process of education, inculcating re-gard for public property and inspiring the self-respect which makes personal cleanness an obligation.
