Ex-Governor Crittendon Has Criticism of Treatment Accorded Guests.

SUGGESTS SOME FUNERALS

Prominent Missourian Declares He Met None of Business Men, Bankers or Builders of City at Congress.

"What Portland needs is a number of prominent citizens... drawn by four black horses and long and imposing corteges of sincere mourners."

Thomas C. Crittendon, of Kansas City, ex-governor of that state, viewed the clouds floating over the city in white winged flocks and continued to express some of the opinions he had formed after a visit of several days here.

"It makes no difference to me whether the glad hand is held out or not for I never expect to be here again. I have lived many years at my home and can continue to do so, but the spirit will be laid for the city here."

St. Louis and Kansas City Example. "St. Louis had to bury some of its old and prominent citizens before they began to grow," continued the speaker.

Has Not Met Business Men. "Portland is a city of roses," said Governor Crittendon, widening on his theme.

"Of all the things that interest me," he said, "the Forestry Building stands first. In contents and in material and in construction it is a thing unique and wonderful."
