SCHOONER IS CONFISCATED

North Proved to Be Engaged in Illegal Fishing.

VICTORIA, B. C., Aug. M.-Justice Marfin this morning gave judgment in the Admiralty Court confiscating the Seattle schooner North, her dories, stores and appurtenances, for poaching off the Van-couver island coast.
