NEWBERN, N. C., Aug. 27.-John foore, a negro, 20 years of age, was taken from Craven County Jall, in this city, early today and lynched by a mob 100 masked men, armed with rifles and evolvers.

With both hands tled behind him the regro was led about a third of a mile from the jail to the draw of Neuse-River bridge, hanged to one of its braces, and his body riddled with bullets.

The members of the mob attacked the juli between 1 and 2 o'clock, this morning. Entrance to the jall was effected by forcing the jailer to surrender the keys. 
