

DOCTORS LAID LOW

Yellow Fever Has Attacked Four in New Orleans.

VARDAMAN ON WARPATH

Blames New Orleans for Infection of Gulf Port and Row Is Threatened—Fruit Imports Are Resumed.

NEW ORLEANS, Aug. 30.—Following a shower in the forenoon, the weather turned warm again and it is probable that the low temperatures of the last few days are over for the present.

Among the list of stricken today are two physicians, making four in all who have succumbed. The latest victims are Dr. J. T. Wolf, who lives along Canal street and has had a large practice among the yellow-fever patients in that quarter.

As to the Gulfport infection, Governor Vardaman, of Mississippi, today said that it came from Mississippi City, and that Mississippi City got it from New Orleans before the quarantine was put on.

The shipment of fruit west through Port Chalmette was successfully launched today. The steamer Estrada arrived, bringing 20,000 bunches of bananas.

The number of new cases has hovered around the same figures for three days. The new feature of the situation outside of the city was the development of two cases at Vicksburg.

Another Case at Natchez. NATCHEZ, Miss., Aug. 30.—After 5 o'clock this afternoon one new case of yellow fever which was reported convalescent was discovered. Otherwise there has been no change in the local yellow fever situation.
