This company is organized by the Midway citizens, on Milwaukie street, between Brooklyn and Sellwood, for the purpose of purchasing a lot at Midway and the erection of a public building for engine house and had The committee appointed at the last meeting of the association, of which Isaac Gratton is chairman, decided that it would be necessary to organize a stock company in order to do business, and dropped the community organization as

nsatisfactory.
C. H. Tabke, president of the Push Club. said yesterday that about \$300 of the stock had been subscribed before the books were opened, but that the books would be ready within a few days. A full report of the action of this committee will be submitted at the regular meeting of the Midway Push Club next Monday evening at the Portland Crematorium. It is thought that the stock will all be taken soon in the neighborhood and the lot purchased at once. The principal ob-ject is to get the lot and quarters erected for an engine, as fire protection is needed in the district. Later, the property will probably come into possession of the city.
