FAMILY REUNION

Ten Brothers and Sisters Will Meet Together.

CHILDREN OF PIONEERS

They Will All Assemble in One Home for the First Time Since They Left the Parental Roof.

Today will begin one of the most remarkable family reunions of the many that have taken place in Portland since the opening of the Lewis and Clark Exposition, to continue till the 25th of the month. Separated 25 years ago, in the springtime of life, the ten daughters and sons of J. W. Davis, a well-known Oregon pioneer, will assemble together at the temporary home of Mrs. Craig, wife of Rev. J. W. Craig, of Oregon City, 424 East Grant street, with their families and some relatives, in all numbering about 50. While they have met occasionally, it will be the first time they have all been together since they left the parental roof to take up the active duties of life. They had this reunion planned over a year ago, and the Exposition caused them to decide to gather in Portland.

The old home is in Putnam County, Missouri. J. W. Davis, the head of the family, crossed the plains to Oregon in 1844, and first settled in McMinnville, Yamhill County, and afterwards moved to Polk County, where Mrs. Davis died in 1872. Mr. Davis returned to his old home, and died while on his way back to Oregon to visit his relatives. He will be remembered in Yamhill and Polk Counties as a pioneer of integrity and an old-time Democrat.

At Home of Mrs. Craig. Mrs. J. W. Craig came to Portland from Oregon City a short time ago and secured a house at 424 East Grant street, has arranged for the reunion and it was largely due to her efforts that it has been brought about. There is no set programme. The gathering will be a family reunion in every sense. The Exposition, which is the center of attraction, will be visited as often as interest and time will allow. A big dinner—several of them—will be enjoyed. "We have come for a good time, to see the Exposition and Portland," said Mrs. Craig. There will be many side trips on the electric cars to Portland Heights, Oregon City, Cananda and elsewhere, at which the eight days of the reunion will pass all too quickly. Beginning today, till the 25th, there will be no dull minutes in this family gathering.
