PHILADELPHIA, Sept 18.—Disagree-shie weather marked the formal opening today of the Elst communication of the Severeign Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Oddfellows. The initial ex-ercises were held in Lulu Temple, which was entirely inadequate to accommodate the crowds. Every jurisdiction of the order is represented at the conclave.

The report of Grand Sire Wright shows the total subordinate lodge membership to

the total subordinate lodge membership to be 1,217,145; encampment membership, 171,... 835; Rebekah membership, 474,669; number of subordinate lodges, 14,315; expenditures for relief, 54,533,645; total revenues, \$13,638,-381; total resources, \$37,645,671. Continuing. the report states:

the report states:

The increase in membership of our subordinate lodges was 65.724; in the encampment branch, 1990; in the Rebekah branch,
20.391, making a total increase of 102.105.
The partiarchs militant will show a decrease
in membership, but that decrease is only
neminnal and doubtless results from a clearing out of names that would not be representative of that branch. The increase in
recipits for the year was \$151,077. The increase in resources was \$2.974,951, and the
increase in releaf \$307,139.
