

BIG CROWDS AT THE RALLIES

Thousands Unable to Enter Madison-Square Garden and Hippodrome.

HEARST WILDLY CHEERED

Ivins, Republican Candidate, Assures Hearers of Confidence in His Victory—Jerome Is Profoundly Grateful.

NEW YORK, Nov. 5.—Enthusiastic rallies by the Democrats and the Municipal Ownership League, at the Hippodrome and at the Madison-Square Garden, respectively, marked the closing of the political campaign tonight. An audience of 12,000 persons filled the garden and thousands of women and children surrounded the building and clamored for admission, defying the efforts of 400 policemen to preserve order. It was only after a troop of mounted men had slowly forced the crowd back that Madison square in front of the garden was cleared.

LIVELY CONTEST IN BAY STATE

State Campaign Will Continue Up to the Last Moment.

BOSTON, Nov. 5.—Although in former years state campaigns in Massachusetts have virtually ended on the Saturday night preceding election day, the programme for this year is an exception to the general rule, and the contest will be conducted with vigor up to midnight tomorrow.

VICTIMS OF AUTOMOBILES

WILD CHEERS FOR HEARST

William Randolph Hearst was the principal speaker at the garden, and was received with an outburst of cheering which lasted for nearly 20 minutes. Mr. Hearst evoked another great demonstration when he assured the audience that his election was beyond question.

TAKEN INTO GREEK CHURCH

UNFROCKED EPISCOPAL PRIEST FINDS A REFUGE.

Ordination of Rev. Ingram N. W. Irvine Is Attended With Great Ceremony at New York.

NEW YORK, Nov. 5.—With much ceremony Rev. Ingram N. W. Irvine, of Philadelphia, formerly rector of St. Joseph's Episcopal Church, Huntington, Pa., and unfrocked by Bishop Ethebert Talbot, was today ordained as a priest of the Holy Orthodox Greek Church in America at the Cathedral of St. Nicholas, by Archbishop Tikhon, head of the Russian church in this country.

RICHMOND, Ind., Nov. 5.—Figures made public here on the membership of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in North America show a total of 768 pastors, 12,528 congregations, 4,255,314 members, 376 parochial school teachers, 32,941 pupils in parochial schools, 571 Sunday schools, 68,165 Sunday-school pupils, and \$1,625,824 contributed for benevolence.
