BERLIN, Nov. 21.-It is semi-officially eclared that the finances of the German Empire are not in a satisfactory condi-tion. The imperial debt, which in 1877 \$18,000,000, now amounts to \$875,000,000; and this will be supplemented by the coming army pension bill, the increase in estimates for army and navy supplies etc., by about \$62,000,000. The new revenues must be covered by additional taxtion and customs duties.


