

AMIRAL COURBET MAY BE A WRECK

French Bark Is Seen Drifting
Upon Vancouver Island
Coast Near Carmanah.

DISAPPEARS AT SUNSET

Dropped by the Tug Pioneer, When
Heavy Seas Cause the Steam
Vessel to Run Short of
Fuel Off Straits.

VICTORIA, B. C., Jan. 28.—(P. M.)—A large bark is within a mile of shore, two and a half miles west of Carmanah, setting in. It is feared she will be lost. The bark was in sight all day and just after sundown drifted around a point and out of sight. It is not known whether she went on the rocks or is anchored. She was in a dangerous position. The tug Pioneer has gone to the assistance of the bark.

NEW YORK, Jan. 28.—The Amiral Courbet is a French bark of 1740 tons and is bound for Tacoma from San Francisco, whence she sailed January 17.

Big Swell on Water.
SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 28.—The Merchants' Exchange has received a dispatch from Seattle saying that Carmanah reports to the Canadian Department of Marine and Fisheries that late this afternoon a large French bark was one mile from shore and drifting in. The weather was calm, but there was a big swell on the water. No tug was in the vicinity. The bark is believed to be the Amiral Courbet, which left San Francisco January 17, in ballast for Port Townsend.

DROPPED BY THE TUG PIONEER
Courbet's Owners Were Trying to
Save Tacoma Charter.

The Amiral Courbet was chartered by Ralston, Guthrie & Co., about a month ago, to load wheat at Portland, with option of Tacoma loading, and it was finally decided to send her to Puget Sound. Her cancelling date was so close at hand that the owners concluded to take no chances with contrary winds, and so engaged the tug Pioneer to tow her north. The Pioneer reached San Francisco from Seattle on the 18th, after a tempestuous voyage, and on the 17th passed through the Golden Gate with the Amiral Courbet in tow. Rough weather, living gales, accompanied by tremendous seas, were encountered off the coast, and on the 24th, when off Cape Flattery, the Pioneer ran short of fuel and was obliged to let go the sailing vessel and run into Port Townsend for a fresh supply of coal. She went to sea again in search of the bark, but failed to find her. The Amiral Courbet left San Francisco with 1200 tons of ballast on board and manned by a full crew in charge of Captain Charrier, and little fear was entertained for her safety when the tug let her go, as she was then fully 70 miles from shore. The sea was rough with a stiff breeze. Like Captain Johnson, of the ill-fated steamer Valencia, Captain Charrier is supposed to have lost his bearings in the heavy weather and allowed his vessel to drift too close to the treacherous shores of Vancouver Island, where the inshore current is such as to give a vessel little if any chance of working out when once in its sweep. Captain Charrier possibly endeavored to sail his vessel into the straits, but in so doing stood too far to the north, and brought up near the scene of the Valencia wreck, on the cliffs at Cape Beale.

The Amiral Courbet registers 1965 tons net. She was built at Nantes, by Chantiers Nantais de Construction Marines, and is of the following dimensions: Length 273 feet; beam, 40 feet; depth of hold, 25 feet. Her charter expired last Monday. She carries a crew of 25 men, all told.

MANN ATTACKS PRESIDENT

Declares He Was Insulted When
"Cyclone of Lies" Broke Out.

NEW YORK, Jan. 28.—(Special.)—Colonel W. D. Mann, editor of Town Topics, tonight issued a long statement in which he attacked President Roosevelt and declares that the charge of criminal perjury, on which he was arrested Saturday, is founded on the testimony of a "cyclone of lies." Continuing, Colonel Mann says that "the White House is enlisted with the Collier rough riders in an attempt to destroy an honorable, honest, clean newspaper." He declares that the President insulted him by returning the free copy of that "marvelously beautiful volume," "Fads and Fancies," which he devoted to the President in "Fads and Fancies" was prepared under the direction of Secretary Loeb, who made changes in the text after the proof was submitted to him.

KING ESCORTS PRINCESS

Royal Party Travels From Biarritz
to San Sebastian in Automobiles.

BIARRITZ, France, Jan. 28.—King Alfonso, accompanied by the military members of his household in full uniform, arrived here today in automobiles to conduct Princess Ena of Battenberg, her mother, Princess Henry and Prince Alexander of Battenberg to San Sebastian. The start for San Sebastian was made at 11:35 A. M. Princess Ena and Henry and King Alfonso were in the first automobile and Prince Alexander and his suite in the second, the military officers following. Everywhere along the route the royal party was enthusiastically greeted. At San Sebastian flowers were showered on the Princesses, to whom the municipality presented magnificent bouquets.

The Queen mother, Marie Christina, received Princess Ena in the most gracious manner. After lunch at the palace, the King and Princesses Henry and Ena took a trip around the town and the surrounding country, returning for tea at the palace. At 5:00 o'clock the Princesses, accompanied by His Majesty and Prince Alexander, left for Biarritz, arriving at the Villa Mouricout at 6:45 o'clock. The King left for San Sebastian on a

special train at 7 o'clock with the Queen mother. It is understood that King Alfonso will proclaim an extensive amnesty on the occasion of the formal announcement of his betrothal.

Government Men Demand Union.

PARIS, Jan. 28.—Six thousand government employees held a meeting here tonight and adopted a resolution demanding that the government frame and have a bill passed permitting its servants to form unions. All classes of public servants were represented, from school mistresses to jailers. Sixty similar meetings were held in the provinces, at each of which a like resolution was adopted.

Honors for Aeronauts.

PARIS, Jan. 28.—At Meudon-sur-Seine, near Paris, Minister of War Etienne today unveiled a monument to the aeronauts who served during the siege of Paris. After the ceremony the Minister presented crosses of the Legion of Honor and other decorations to the surviving aeronauts. The monument was designed by Bartoldi.

TEA AT SOLDIERS' HOME

Chinese Commissioners Entertained
by Commandant.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—With the exception of a visit to the Soldiers' Home here and several calls on special Chinese Commissioners visiting this country, spent the day quietly resting. Brigadier-General Hamilton Hawkins, governor of the Soldiers' Home, entertained the Commissioners informally at tea this afternoon. Following this there were calls on Ambassador Speck von Sternberg, of Germany, and Ambassador Hengelmüller, of Austria-Hungary, whose countries the Commissioners are to visit before returning to China. Tomorrow the whole party will go to Mount Vernon on the Dolphin.

DITCHED BY BROKEN RAIL

Passengers on Frisco Limited Are
Given a Shaking.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Jan. 28.—The Frisco Limited, bound for Kansas City, which left here Saturday night at 10:20 over the St. Louis & San Francisco Railroad, was wrecked one mile north of Dora, about 40 miles from Birmingham, 20 minutes after midnight. The accident was due to a broken rail. The mail and baggage-car turned over and the second-class coach, carrying a number of negroes, was derailed. The express messenger and the postal clerk and several passengers were injured, none seriously. In connection with its fight for cheaper gas Chicago is much interested in the situation at Cleveland. Consumers there have been paying only 75 cents for their gas for the last five years, and the power seldom runs below 17 candle-power. Besides making this price the Cleveland companies pay 8 per cent of their gross receipts to the city treasury as compensation for the use of the streets. The companies are all thriving with gas at this price. In fact, the people of Cleveland are so sure they are making an unreasonable profit that there is a great howl now for 60-cent gas. One company which is piping natural gas into Cleveland has a contract with the city that if the natural fuel gives out the company will furnish artificial gas for 40 cents. It is the significance of this agreement that has stirred the people of that city to demand cheaper gas than they are now getting.

Advocates of 85 Cents.

On account of the report of a special commission employed by the Chicago Council to investigate the cost of manufacturing and distributing gas to consumers, there is some disposition in the Council to enact an ordinance making the price of gas 85 cents, on the ground that the figures of the experts tend to show that would be a fair and reasonable price in Chicago until more economical methods of making gas are found. Mayor Dunne and the other advocates of 75-cent gas have not been convinced that they are wrong in holding out for the lower price, and they offer strong arguments sustaining their attitude. Based on these arguments on the very figures adduced by the municipal experts. Here is one line of reasoning: The People's Gas Light & Coke Company already has volunteered to reduce the cost of gas from 81 to 80 cents. This offer was made after Attorney James E. Meagher for that company had made a statement declaring that the cost of manufacture and distribution is 83.33 cents per thousand cubic feet. Getting their data in part from the books of the People's Company, the experts show that the price of manufacture and distribution is only 45 cents, 8 cents less than the gas company's figures. If these figures are correct, say Mayor Dunne and his friends, the conclusion is plain that the company can furnish gas profitably for at least 8 cents less than the 90 cents quoted; in other words at 82 cents. By a fair disregard of overcapitalization, they do not see why this could not be equitably reduced to 75 cents.

Professor A. C. Humphreys, of Hoboken, N. J., submitted figures showing that the cost of manufacture, distribution and repairs is 58 cents, and that the company ought to have at least 55 cents for its gas. In view of the offer of 50-cent gas, these figures will not have very serious consideration.

In connection with their report the accountants said: "We should have been accorded an opportunity of more fully examining several of the distributing and other accounts in the ledgers that bear directly on this investigation, but this was denied. If we had had access to these accounts the cost of manufacture and distribution might have been somewhat further modified."

Injured in Street-Car Collision.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Jan. 28.—In a collision at Thirty-ninth and Moneta avenues tonight between two cars of the Company line of the Los Angeles Railway Company, three persons were injured. Mrs. H. V. Harris, of 43 West Forty-third street, was probably fatally hurt through concussion of the spine. The two other women were slightly injured.
