WEATHER CONDITIONS. The disturbance noted yesterday at sea has advanced inland sufficiently far to cause general rains in California, Oregon, Washington and Northwestern Idaho. The rain was heaviest in California and it amounted to over an inch at San Francisco. The temperature has changed but little since yesterday. The following maximum wind velocities occurred during the last 24 hours: Tacoma Island, Wash., 60 miles east, and North Head, Wash., 55 miles east. The indications are for rain in this district Thursday. East of the Cascade Mountains some snow may be expected Friday.
