

HEALTH OF PORTSMOUTH

Initiative One Hundred Gets Report on Diphtheria in the Schools.

CONFINED TO PORTSMOUTH

Dr. C. H. Wheeler Vigorously Denies Charges Made by Investigating Committee—Says Lack of Sewerage is Cause.

Diphtheria is altogether too prevalent in Portsmouth, for the reason that the city quarantine regulations have not been enforced by the Health Department, according to the report made by an investigating committee of the Initiative One Hundred, a civic association that is now taking a deep interest in various municipal affairs.

Dr. C. H. Wheeler, chief of Health, is so confident that the local physician should undertake this work, for others are paid to attend to the patients, and that no long as this condition exists quarantine regulations will be of no avail.

Report of the Committee.

Your committee, appointed to investigate the health conditions of Portsmouth, reports as follows: We addressed a communication to each school principal of Portland to ascertain how many deaths from contagious diseases had occurred during the period beginning with the Fall term. But four deaths were reported.
