WEATHER CONDITIONS. The barometer continues high in the North Pacific States, while in California there is a slight fall in pressure. No rain has yet fallen, but the conditions are becoming somewhat threatening in California. It is cooler in Southern and Eastern Oregon, Idaho and Montana. Elsewhere the changes in weather have been unimportant. The indications are for fair and warmer weather in this district Saturday.
