This makes a total risk of \$296,780,000. From this deduct 15 per cent to arrive at the insurance in the burned district, and one has the total of \$252,-363,000. The domestic companies, on the 15 per cent deduction, have risks to the amount of \$135,155,750 in the burnt district, and to meet it have a capital and surplus of \$131,437,090. While the risks of the foreign companies, on sis, amount to \$114,287,750, and their surplus in America amounts to only \$31,989,000, yet they have a world capital and surplus of \$138,887,000.
