

F. PIERCE MAYS MUST STAND TRIAL

Judge Hunt Decides His Physical Condition Good Enough to Stand the Ordeal.

SHEDS TEARS IN COURT

Today He Is Ordered to Appear and Choose the Case Under Which He Will Be Tried.

Franklin Pierce Mays, State Senator, will be forced to go to trial, in spite of his declaration that he is ill.

Judge Hunt late yesterday afternoon announced that he thought that Mr. Mays was in good physical condition to stand the ordeal of facing a jury.

"I believe firmly that if Mr. Mays is forced to trial he will go to pieces," said W. D. Fenton, chief judge Hunt announced his decision.

The court took an opposite view, however, and the defendant will be required to appear before Judge Hunt at 10 o'clock this morning and indicate his choice of cases under which to be tried.


