### SEVENTY BODIES ON WRECK

Diver Sees Into Sirlo's Interior. Spain Raises Relief Fund.

CARTAGENA, Aug. E.-A diver assisting in the salvage of the wrecked Italian steamer Sirio, says he saw 70 hodies in the interior of the vessel. He made an unsuccessful attempt to enable the salvage corps to raise the safe of the steamer. The steamer is wedged between two rocks, and is listed 45 degrees to star-

Subscriptions for the relief of the destitute survivors have reached the sum of \$28,000. Theaters everywhere are giving benefits in behalf of the fund.

LONDON, Aug. 8.—Boniface Nattar, Lord Abbot of St. Mary's Abbey, Buck-fastleigh, Devonshire, and another pre-late belonging to the abbey were on board the wrecked steamer Sirio. As nothing has been heard of them, all hopes that they escaped have been given up.
