

PENDELTON FAIR

COUNTY COURT OF UMATILLA GIVES \$1000.

Success of the Project Now Assured, as the City Will Raise a Much Larger Sum.

PENDELTON, Or., Aug. 10.—(Special.)—The Umatilla County Court this evening appropriated \$1000 to be turned over to the District Fair Association to be expended in providing a county exhibit at the fair which is to be held in this city September 24 to 28. This makes a total of \$2500 which is now available and the success that has attended all efforts in the enterprise so far still continues.

The appropriation by the County Court was made possible by an act of the 1903 Legislature, which gives county courts the authority to appropriate a sum of money, not to exceed \$10,000, each year out of the general county fund for the purpose of advertising the resources of the county and making exhibits of the same at county, state and district fairs.

The application for the \$1000 appropriation was made to the court yesterday morning by the executive committee of the fair commission, and after carefully considering the matter all day, and consulting with as many of the large taxpayers in different parts of the County as possible, the County Judge and Commissioners decided that it was for the best interests of the County to make the appropriation.

If this action had not been taken by the Commissioners there was danger of the enterprise falling through, and if that event the \$1000 appropriation would have been lost. As it is, there is now in sight \$3500 which, added to the \$4000 which will be raised in Pendleton, makes an assured fact that the first agricultural fair to be held in this district since it was created will be a credit to the counties comprising the district and the State itself.

In addition to the sums named, it is expected that Morrow County will appropriate a sum of money sufficient to enable the fair committee to provide a creditable exhibit.

Few Schoolmasters Nowadays. (CORVALLIS, Or., Aug. 10.—Special.)—Twenty-seven applicants participated in a teachers examination which was concluded here tonight by Superintendent Denman. A feature is that of the whole number of applicants 25 were young women and only two were of the sterner sex, one being a boy of 18.

The incident shows how women are driving men from the profession in Oregon so far as the public schools are concerned.
