CROP OUTLOOK BRIGHTENS

Generous Precipitation After 44 Days of Sunshine in Oregon, Washington and Idaho Will Be Boon to Agriculture.

Thunderstorms accompanied by considerable rainfall are expected today and for the next few days, perhaps, over the district from the Rocky Mountains to the Pacific Ocean and extending well south into California. For the last 44 days, or since June 29, the Northwest States, Oregon, Washington and Idaho, have been almost entirely without rain.
