

SEEKING A ROUTE FOR THE ELDER

Owner Peterson Says Portland Merchants Should Give His Boat Preference.

REPAIRS ABOUT FINISHED

Steamer That was Submerged in the Columbia River More Than a Year Will be Released from Drydock in Short Time.

The steamer George W. Elder, which was wrecked in the Columbia River off Goble, Or., in January, 1905, and which was successfully raised last May by J. H. Peterson, of this city, will shortly be ready for commission, and Mr. Peterson, his partner in the vessel, C. P. Doe, of the North Pacific Steamship Company, are casting about for a route for the vessel.

The vessel is in better condition than she ever was before the accident which caused her to be submerged in the Columbia river last year. The owners are of the opinion that the vessel should be given preference by the local merchants when they trade with the Columbia river.

On the other hand, persons familiar with the demands of the local trade, believe that the Elder is entirely too small to be operated between Portland and San Francisco for the representatives of Portland firms who visited Seattle recently.

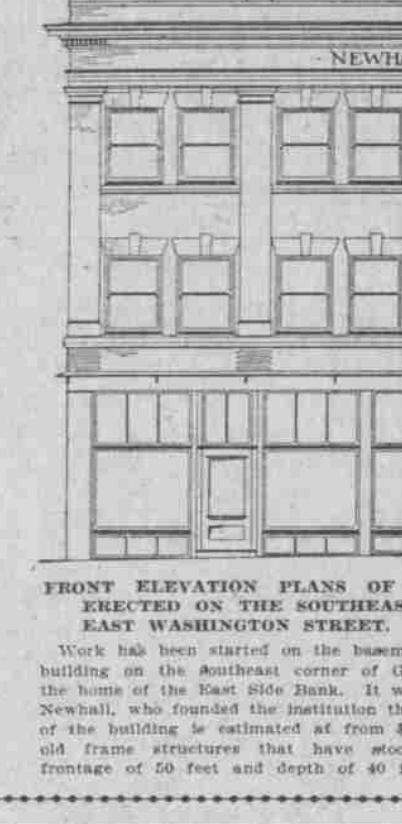
DRYDOCK DEWEY IN OPERATION

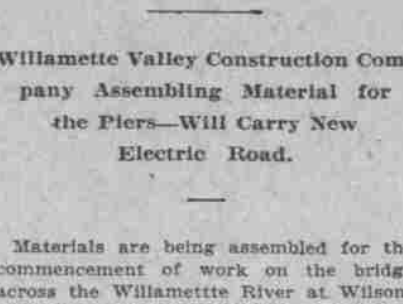
