

CRIMINALS' FULL CONFESSIONS READ

Stenographer Translates to The Jury Statement Made by Hose.

DETAILS ARE REVOLVING

Defense Puts Witnesses on Stand to Prove One-Time Good Character. Prosecution Closes Case. Trial Nears End.

In all probability the Hose murder case will go to the jury in the Circuit Court sometime today, as the prosecution rested at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon, and the defense had almost finished the introduction of testimony when the hour for adjournment arrived.

Judging from the questions asked some of the witnesses by the defendant's counsel, it is likely that an effort will be made to save Hose's neck by the plea that he was mentally irresponsible for his acts at the time he committed the deed.

The morning session of Judge Gantenbein's court was taken up with the examination of Deputy City Physician W. D. Spencer, Patrolman J. H. Rice, Police Captain J. Moore, and Deputy Coroner Arthur L. Finley.

His Confession Is Read. In the afternoon Julia Maxwell, a stenographer, who took down the statement of defendant made to District Attorney Manning shortly after the murder, was the first witness for the prosecution, and a long wrangle ensued.




