Northern Pacific Files Annual Report at Salem.

STATISTICS IN PLENTY

Company Makes Statement of Earnings and Expenses as Required by Oregon Law and Goes Even Further.

SALEM, Or., Nov. 12.—(Special)—The Northern Pacific Railway Company today filed in the office of the Secretary of State its annual report, as required by law, and as recently demanded by Governor Chamberlain.

The total mileage of the road is 5792 miles, with stock and obligation outstanding in the amount of \$18,908 per mile. The passenger income was \$16,244,696 during the past year and the freight earnings \$43,016,181, which, with other earnings to the amount of \$1,371,779, made a total of \$61,532,655.

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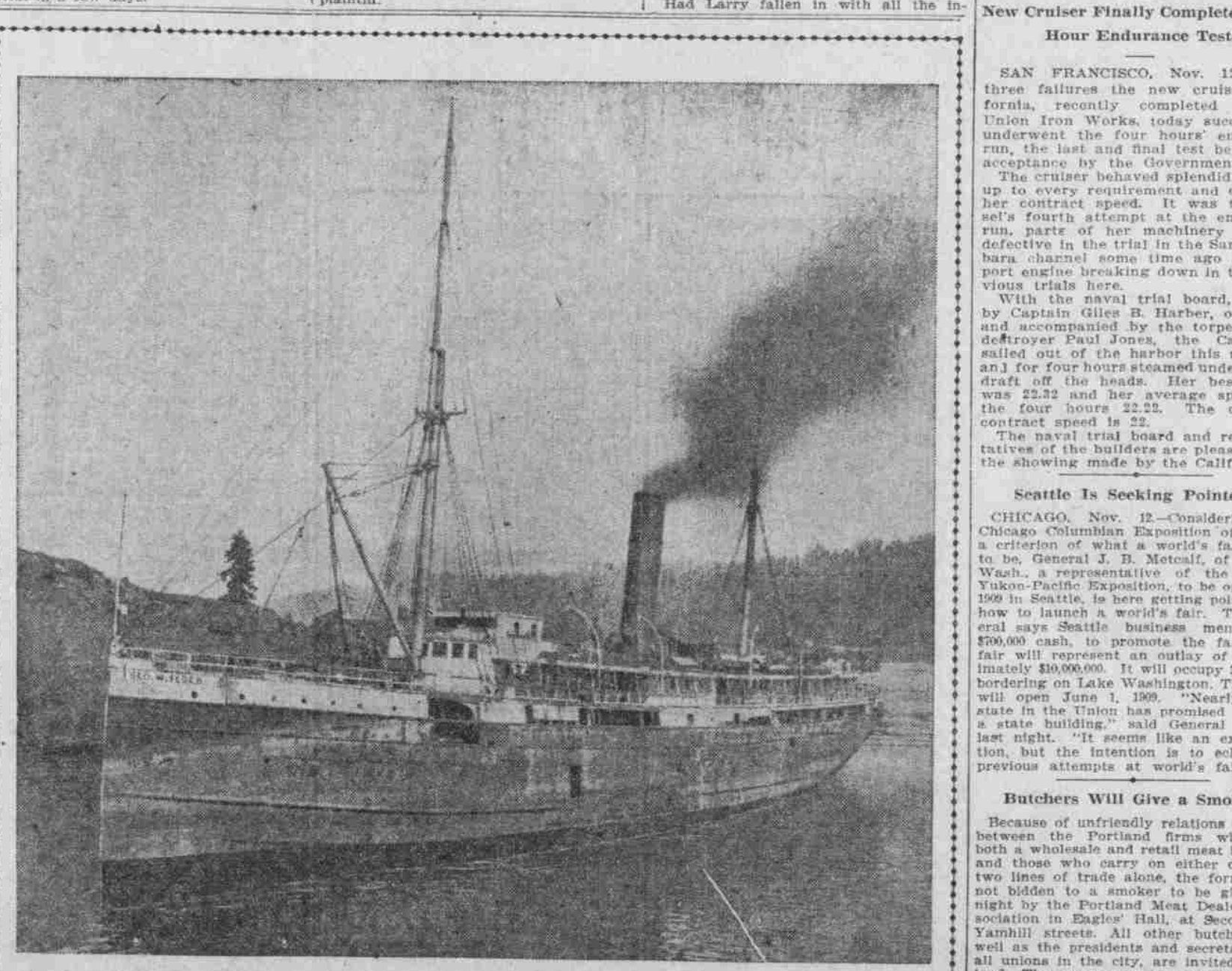
