Lottie Gilson a Wreck

POPULAR VAUDEVILLIAN FOUND DRUNK ON STREET.

Pitiful End of Woman Who Played in Portland—Was Sick and Destitute Here.

NEW YORK, Jan. 17.—(Special.)—Lottie Gilson, who several years ago was one of the most popular favorites on the vaudeville stage, was arrested on the street here last night on a charge of intoxication. She was too drunk to stand and a policeman half carried her to the station house.

When arraigned in court today with petty thieves, Miss Gilson was subjected to a lecture by the magistrate, who discharged her.

Last January Miss Gilson turned up sick and destitute at a sanitarium in Portland, Or.

Lottie Gilson, known as the "Little Magnet" from one end of the country to the other, has appeared in Portland dozens of times and her name is familiar to nearly all Portland theater-goers. She appeared at the Grand last winter and in January became sick and was a patient at the North Pacific Sanitarium for several weeks. Before she recovered from her illness she became destitute and was aided by her friends in the city.

Lottie Gilson has been on the vaudeville stage for years. Portland theatrical men say that she was the most popular and most talented soubrette ever to appear on Broadway, New York.

SOCIAL LEADER A FORGER

Railroad Lawyer Railroaded From Office to Penitentiary.

ST. LOUIS, Jan. 17.—Horace B. Hand, an attorney and chief clerk of the law department of the St. Louis & San Francisco Railroad Company, was arrested here today, charged with forgery. He pleaded guilty, was sentenced to five years in the state prison, and was sent at once to Jefferson City. Hand enjoyed social prominence in the suburb of Kirkwood and his arrest created consternation in the community.
