

Council Committee Completes East Side Task.

ORDINANCE IS PREPARED

Measure Probably Will Be Passed by City Legislative Body-Exception Made in Favor of Southern Pacific.

Fire limits for the East Side were mapped out yesterday by the special Council committee appointed for that purpose. The ordinance prepared by the committee, from the present outlook, is to be nature of the ground. passed by the Council at its meeting Wednesday. A compromise was made yesterday with the Southern Pacific and E. M. Brannick and Whitney L. Boise, who have been leading the fight for the fire limits, agreed to the ordinance.

Instead of running up East First street from East Burnside as originally planned, the west line will go up East
Second street to East Oak street and then
down East Water, thus enabling the
Southern Pacific to account a few street and then
Was made to the police this morning
by Mrs. Mildred Cozeau that while she Southern Pacific to erect a frame freight house on the northwest corner of East Oak and East Second streets. If the

East Cak and East Second streets was included in the limits that the Southern Pacific would not erect the freight-house,

anxious to have built.

The Southern Pacific Company has taken out a permit to erect a depot at the corner of East Morrison and East First streets, which is inside the limits. First streets, which is inside the limits. Now that the permit has been taken out the company cannot be prohibited from erecting the building. An effort will be made to induce the Southern Facific to put up a stone or brick building instead of a frame structure.

The fire limits as recommended by the special committee are as follow:

DEFICIENCY APPROPRIATION GOES THROUGH THE HOUSE.

Large Sums to Attorneys-Senate Passes Two County Division Bills. Optional License Favored.
