Season at Baker and Empire Will End Earlier Than Usual.

FORM NEW CORPORATION

Business Changes Demand Reorganization of Company Owning Two Playhouses—Fact Explains Announcement of Management.

The regular season at both the Baker and Empire theaters will close on June 1 and both these popular playhouses will probably be dark until Fall. Notices to this effect were posted on the stages of both theaters last night. The information of members of the two stock companies, June 1 has been from time immemorial the date for closing the theater season in most of the cities of the country, although in Portland the custom has not always been observed. Both theaters have enjoyed the greatest degree of prosperity in their history during the past eight months and would probably continue to do a thriving business during the summer months but certain business changes have demanded the management to close promptly on the first of next month.

A reorganization of the Baker Theater Corporation, which controls both the Baker and Empire theaters, was announced yesterday. It was decided to reorganize the company, and the account of the withdrawal of John Sampson from the company, Mr. Sampson, who has been treasurer and one of the principal stockholders, recently disposed of his interest to George L. Baker and severed all connection with local theatrical affairs. He has gone to Boston, where he will have a stock company of which Lillian Lawrence will be leading woman. Miss Lawrence, accompanied by her daughter, Ethel Terry, left yesterday for Boston where she will resume acting on May 15.

In order to settle up all the affairs of the present corporation, and effect the reorganization of another it was decided to close the season on the date named. All the other stockholders will participate in the reorganization of the Baker Theater Corporation. Mr. Baker will continue as general manager and will have a larger interest than ever before.
