FIGHT 20 ROUNDS TO DRAW

DECISION IN SULLIVAN-KELLY FIGHT SATISFACTORY.

Chicago Pugilist Scores Only Knockdown in Speedy Bout Before the Los Angeles Athletic Club.

LOS ANGELES, May 10.—Jack "Twin" Sullivan, of Boston, and Hugo Kelly, of Chicago, fought 20 rounds to a draw before the Pacific Athletic Club tonight.

The decision was received by the crowd with entire satisfaction. Neither man was very badly damaged.

Kelly scored the only knockdown of the fight in the fourth round. He sent Sullivan to the floor with a left to the point of the jaw. The latter recovered quickly, however, and finished the round without trouble.

In the eighth round Kelly knocked Sullivan to his knees with a blow that landed below the belt. Referee Burns motioned Kelly aside, warning him about the foul. The Boston fighter recovered almost on the instant, however, and seemed uninjured.

The 17th was the best round of the fight. Kelly rushed throughout the entire three minutes and fought with vigor, the Chicago fighter having the better of the round.

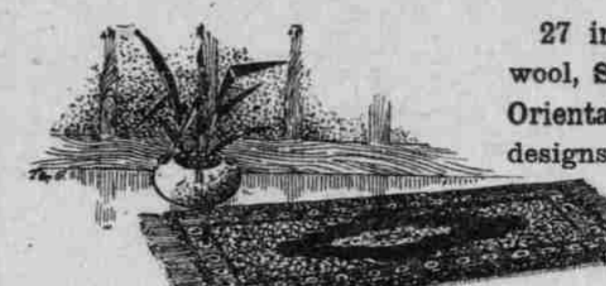
