STORY DENIED BY ELLIOTT

HEAD OF NORTHERN PACIFIC NOT FIGHTING HILL

Says Rumor That He is Seeking Control of His Road is Absurd

Howard Elliott, president of the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, strongly denies the rumor that he is seeking to wrest control of that property from the Hill interests.

President Elliott is the head of a party of high officials of the Northern Pacific who arrived in a special train from Seattle yesterday over the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad.

"We are showing Mr. Nutt over the territory," said President Elliott. "He has not wanted these lines before and we want to introduce him to his new field."

"This trip is one of inspection of the country served by our lines. We are doing a large amount of work along the line which may hinder us somewhat just at present in our business, but it will tell in time."

"Work on the Portland & Seattle is going on well and we expect to have the road from Portland to Pasco in operation by the end of the year."

"Our party left from the mouth of the Columbia, where we inspected the jetty work. We went out nearly to the end of the breakwater. It looks like it will do the work all right."

"Portland looks good to me. I went over the new terminals here today and spent an hour and a half looking over the city."

President Elliott did not say when the terminal differences here will be settled, but said negotiations are still going on.

The officials are registered at the Portland Hotel. They took dinner last night at the Arlington Club with J.

Couch Flanders, legal representative of the Hill interests here.
