SAN FRANCISCO, June 30.—(Special.)—The Beavers pulled off the double sensation in baseball circles here and in Oakland today by hanging it on the Commuters twice running. The North-erners cantered in with the Oakland game, the finish being six to four. The afternoon struggle was a bit closer, but McCredie and his men held the whip hand all the time and were never in any real danger of being headed. The crowd was for Portland nearly to a man. The good ball that the Beavers have been putting up during the last few games had apparently won every fan over.

Groom pitched a grand game in the afternoon. He had a bunch of speed all the time and never lacked control of the ball. The Commuters managed to bunch two hits on him during the third, tying up the score by sending a run over, but Portland got the tally back in the next period. This was the last run of the day. Schimpff was the star fielder of the afternoon. He had eight chances and got away with every one without the semblance of an error. Randolph was relieved by Hogan in the Oakland box after the fourth and held Portland down to one hit from that time on. Califf, the man whom the Commuters have not beaten this year, upheld his reputation in the morning game across the bay. Oakland was lucky to get one run, for the youngster had everything.
