**PUT THEM IN JAIL****Woodrow Wilson's Penalty for Trust Kings.****TREAT THEM AS CRIMINALS**

President of Princeton Says Fining and Dissolving of Corporations Is Not the Remedy—Holds Individuals Responsible.

NORFOLK, Va., July 4.—Governor Hughes, of New York, and Woodrow Wilson, president of Princeton University, were the orators of the day at the joint Independence day celebration and first annual reunion of the United descendants of the signers of the Declaration of Independence at the Jamestown Exposition today. The descendants' reunion being held under the auspices of the Thomas Jefferson Memorial Association, or which ex-Secretary of the Navy Hilary Herbert is the acting president. A military parade, reviewed by Mr. Hughes and others, preceded the formal exercises of the day which were opened with the singing of "America" by a chorus of several hundred school children.

Ex-Governor Roberts, of Connecticut, vice-president of the Jefferson Memorial Association, presided, and spoke briefly, being followed by the reading by William Shields McKean, of New Jersey, founder and secretary of the Memorial Association, of the list of vice-presidents representing the 34 original states and named by the respective Governors of these states. President Tucker of the exposition today, delivered an address of welcome, the Declaration of Independence was read by Hollis N. Randolph, of Atlanta, a great-great-grandson of Thomas Jefferson.

Stock manipulations he called 'sheer thefts,' and says they should be punished as such. Failure to do so, in his mind, is like overlooking highway robbery."

BOND COMPANY NOT LIABLE

Local Bondsmen of Robbed Treasurer Must Make Loss Good.

GALLIPOLIS, Ohio, July 4.—Some misunderstanding arose over the verdict returned yesterday in the case of the local bondsmen of Thomas J. Chase, ex-County Treasurer of Meigs County, against the United States Fidelity Guaranty Company, of Baltimore, Md. The verdict, instead of being adverse to, was in favor of the guaranty company, as it relieved the company of all responsibility on account of the disappearance of \$15,000 from the County Treasurer's vault at the time Chase said he had been attacked by robbers, who had looked him in the safe and taken the money.

Twenty-seven local men were on Chase's bond as Treasurer. The guaranty company was under \$15,000 bonds to guarantee the county against loss by robbery. Chase was tried on the charge of having taken the money himself, and was acquitted.

His bondsmen made good the shortage and they undertook to hold the guaranty company, under its bond indemnifying the county against robbery. They sued and the verdict was the outcome. The verdict held that the company was not liable.
