

SEATTLE MEN SEE INTERIOR OREGON

Capitalists Make Careful Inspection of Prineville Country.

BALLINGER WITH PARTY

President of Deschutes Railroad Company Returning From Klamath Falls—Operations of the Party Are Kept Secret.

PRINEVILLE, Or., July 25.—(Special.)—The Gregory-Nelson party of Seattle capitalists passed through here today en route to Shaniko. The party arrived in two automobiles and lunched at a local hotel. R. A. Ballinger, Commissioner of the General Land Office and president of the Deschutes Railroad Company, was a member of the party.

This party has given more time to the inspection of the Central Oregon country than the Kruttschnitt party last week. Mr. Gregory's inspection has been thorough and exhaustive and covered many square miles of cultivated and uncultivated land in Crook County.

While his movements have been closely observed, Mr. Gregory has given out absolutely no information as to the plans of his railroad company. The estimate of the movements of the party, some of the members going so far, it is said, as to register under assumed names.

During the travels of the Kruttschnitt party last week, the members appeared to be in a hurry to get out of the country as rapidly as possible. Not so with the present crowd. Mr. Gregory is still in Crook County, and taking the stage for Agency Plains for a further examination of the wheat belt.

WAY CLEAR ON THE EAST SIDE

North Coast Finds Its Only Difficulty in Marshall Canyon.

NORTH YAKIMA, Wash., July 25.—(Special.)—President Stearns, of the North Coast Railroad, announced today that the company has now a clear course on the east side of the Columbia River, having arranged for the entire right of way over that part of the route of the road. On this side of the river, however, the company is up against obstruction tactics of the Northern Pacific in Marshall Canyon. Mr. Stearns states that the report sent out that the company might avoid protracted litigation over the passage of the canyon gap by tunneling through the west of the Northern Pacific right of way, is incorrect. PEAK REFLECTED IN THE SKY

Mirage Witnessed by Those Who Saw Rainier Monday Morning.

TACOMA, July 25.—(Special.)—A marvelous mirage was witnessed Monday morning at Tacoma, where Mr. F. A. Craver, of Tacoma, and Mr. and Mrs. Cain Longmire at Longmire Springs. The entire northeast side of Mount Rainier was reflected in the sky, the vision lasting for about three minutes, then disappearing as rapidly as it had formed. The mirage was one of the most perfect ever seen on the mountain. The entire northeast side of the mountain stood reflected in the sky, every crag and boulder standing as vividly as the mountain itself.

Speaking of the strange occurrence, Cain Longmire said:

"I have lived on this mountain side over 20 years and never before have I seen a mirage of that side of the mountain. I cannot say what was the condition that would cause such a clear mirage except that it was very early in the morning and the atmosphere was exceptionally clear and cold."

NO SUNDAY BOOZE AT SEASIDE

Lid Comes Down With Bang at Ocean Side Resorts.

ASTORIA, July 25.—(Special.)—In accordance with instructions received from District Attorney Hedger, Deputy Attorney McCue today notified the saloonkeepers in Clatsop County that their places of business must be closed from midnight on Saturday until Monday morning. McCue today notified the saloonkeepers that it was his duty to see that the Sunday closing law is strictly enforced in the future. Sheriff Pomroy left this afternoon to serve notice on the saloonkeepers in the various parts of the county. No attempt to evade the order is expected in this city, as aside from those in the restricted districts the majority of the saloonkeepers are in favor of Sunday closing, some having openly advocated it as it will give themselves and their employees a holiday. The order will be more seriously felt at Seaside than at any other place in the county as there the Sunday trade is naturally the largest of any single day in the week.

Gets Dying Man to Deed Him Property, Then Refuses to Bury Him.

SEATTLE, Wash., July 25.—(Special.)—When Patrick McGurk lay dying at the wayside hospital he ordered a deed drawn transferring his property to Dr. E. F. PREPARING FOR AUTO RUN

DEALERS ALL SHOW INTEREST IN ENDURANCE TEST.

Cars Will Run From Portland to Salem and Return Next Saturday With Only One Stop.

The committee of the Automobile Dealers Association of Oregon, in very busy making the final arrangements for the big endurance run to be held to Salem and return next Saturday. A. Bennett, chairman of the committee, made the course yesterday and made arrangements for checking and timing the machines and also for the accommodation of the contestants and their guests.

A great many of the entrants have gone over the course to get familiar with the road and several of them report that their cars have made the trip with perfect scores. In order to make a perfect score the car must travel from here to Salem without stopping for an instant or without being adjusted or repaired. At Salem they will be allowed to take on gasoline and oil but will not be allowed to make any adjustments or repairs on the car. The car must then run from Salem back to Portland again without a second stop, except for the signature of the control-keeper at McMinnville. Cars can also take on water at McMinnville, in which case they will not be allowed to stop the motor.

Those who have gone over the course state that the roads are in very good condition. The trip will be a very easy one, but the contestants are anxious to show that their car will make the run without any trouble. The first car will leave Portland on Eighth and Everett streets at 7 A. M. and will arrive in Salem about 10:30 o'clock, one hour and 30 minutes will be allowed for lunch, and the same car will arrive in Portland about 5 P. M.
