GET RID OF BLIND HUSBAND

WOMAN ACCUSED OF POISONING BROTHER-IN-LAW.

Wanted Sister's Company and Is Accused of Murder in Order to Accomplish Her End.

LA CROSSE, Wis., Aug. 31.—(Special)—While Mrs. Mary Malin, aged 60 years, a member of one of the leading German families in Western Wisconsin, is in a cell in the Vernon County Jail, detectives are attempting to unravel one of the strangest murder mysteries ever recorded in this section, in which Carl Schmidt, a blind farmer, aged 65, was poisoned.

Though no special charge of murder has been lodged against Mrs. Malin, the coroner's jury found sufficient evidence to warrant holding her.

Schmidt and his wife, Pauline Schmidt, lived on a farm eight miles out of Harmony, near Genoa, Wis., just south of La Crosse. Mrs. Schmidt is a sister of Mrs. Malin, who lives in this city.

Mrs. Malin made a visit to her sister six weeks ago. Upon her arrival at the Schmidt farm, witnesses testified, Mrs. Malin sought to induce Mrs. Schmidt to send her blind husband to the poorhouse and return with her to La Crosse.

Mrs. Malin then sought to have Mrs. Schmidt induce her husband to deed all of his property to her wife that he might go to the poor farm without giving away his holdings.

Greshel went to the Schmidt home Thursday afternoon, carrying with him a bottle of diluted and sweetened alcohol, which is a popular drink of the community.
