

ANNOUNCE SALT LAKE LINE SOON

Confirmation Expected From E. P. Clark, President of Mount Hood Road.

WILL COME TO PORTLAND

Incorporators of Portland Eastern Retire, but Do Not Deny Reports That Eastern System Will Have Utah Connection.

The Portland Eastern Railway Company, that will build a road southward from Portland through Central Oregon to a connection with one or more Eastern trunk lines, was quietly incorporated June 3, with a capital stock of \$5,000,000.

These men are extremely reticent regarding the ultimate destination of the Portland Eastern. They say that until rights of way are secured affording an entrance to Portland, they cannot speak as to the ultimate objects of the company.

It can readily be seen that all the rumors and statements that have been made regarding this company in the matter are wholly wrong.

Settling Rights of Way. "We are in trouble at a dozen points just outside of Portland over rights of way," said an official of the company last night.

That these right-of-way matters will not retard the progress of the road seriously, however, is indicated by the grading of the road now going forward between Bull Run and Fairview.

The construction of the power-house itself is also going forward. Large forces of men are at work on the foundations and erection of the big power-generating station will continue all winter.

Clark Coming to Portland. E. P. Clark, president of the Mount Hood Railway & Power Company, and the man who mapped out the project of the Portland Eastern, a later development of the original scheme, will be in Portland within the next 10 days and will probably be ready to make official announcements of the purposes of the Portland & Eastern Railway.

Everything so far given out concerning the Clark projects here lends confirmation to the story of the Portland Eastern just printed. Mr. Clark, on his last visit here, said his company will not depend on franchises through the streets to enter the city, but will acquire private right of way. Warned, no doubt, by the rough sledding the Southern Pacific has had during the past year to retain its Fourth-street franchise, Mr. Clark will not attempt to haul freight trains in and out of Portland on tracks laid by virtue of temporary franchises in the center of city streets.

The surveys already completed far up the Deschutes and options held on property in Central Oregon, together with water rights all along the path of the project for electric power development, all point to one thing—a new direct railroad connection between Salt Lake City and Portland, which will be the biggest thing for the Rose City in the railway

PLANS ARE MISUNDERSTOOD

Manager of Mount Hood Road Explains Bull Run Suit.

PORTLAND, OR., Sept. 30.—(To the Editor.)—It has not been the purpose of the Mount Hood Railway & Power Company to use the press of the city or state to in any way further its interests, believing it best to let our works speak for themselves. But in order to correct a grievous wrong and set the matter right before the people of Portland, I beg space in your columns for a few lines.

The plans of the Mount Hood Railway & Power Company do not include any rights in the Bull Run forest reserve above the city's headworks or in any of the watershed that supplies the Bull Run reservoir. Nor has there been action taken or contemplated by this company that can be construed as tending to impair the city's rights or to trespass upon the said watershed for any purpose whatever.

This was all precipitated by an effort to obtain the right to build a railway across some city property located in the bed of the Bull Run and Sandy Rivers, where the two streams join. The matter was taken up and discussed with the Mayor, members of the Water and Executive Boards and the City Attorney for their advice as to the best course to pursue.
