

BANKER HEINZE DOWN AND OUT

Eliminated From Financial Organizations by the New York Clearing-House.

MOVE TO PREVENT CRISIS

Assistance Will Be Rendered Firms Which Have Been Under Suspension - Mercantile National Reorganized.

MILLIKEN SUCCEEDS HEINZE

New Officers Selected for the Mercantile National Bank.

NEW YORK, Oct. 20.-At a late hour the Associated Press was assured by the Clearing House committee that the financial crisis which has been eliminated from the banking organizations of New York City, and in the light of this fact, the Clearing House Association announced its readiness to lend all necessary aid to any of the banks which have been under suspension, the Clearing House investigation having established their solvency. It is believed that this action will prevent any crisis in New York banking circles.

STAND BEHIND THE BANK.

Neither the members of the board of the Mercantile National nor the clearing-house committee would add to these announcements. The statement of Mr. Sherer is, however, that the clearing-house committee is perfectly satisfied with the reorganization of the Mercantile National Bank, and will see that the bank is enabled to meet any crisis that the widely-published story about its condition, following the collapse of the Heinze corner in United Copper, may force it to face.

Will Restore Confidence.

William Skinner, who was elected vice-president of the bank, is president of William Skinner Manufacturing Company, and is a director of the number of railroad companies, including the New York, New Haven & Hartford.

Morse's Former Connections.

Mr. Morse was connected with the following institutions: National Bank of North America, New Amsterdam National Bank, and Garfield National Bank, in all of which he was vice-president, as well as director; Mercantile National Bank, Gulf Field Safe Deposit Company, Fourteenth Street Bank, New Amsterdam Safe Deposit Company, New York Mortgage & Security Company, New York Produce Exchange Bank, Title Insurance Company of New York, Van Norden's Safe Deposit Company and Van Norden Trust Company, in all of which he was a director.
