GAIN IN COUNTY EARNINGS

October Statement of Receipts and Expenses by Clerk Fields.

The statement of the receipts and expenditures of the county during October was issued yesterday by County Clerk Fields. It shows that a profit of \$23,573 has been made for the county, while in 1906 the profit was \$24,611, and in 1901 the county lost \$17,773. In the County Court records during the month just closed the cost about 3 cents per pound; squash and potatoes, 2 cents; sweet potatoes, onions and parsnips, 5 cents. Mushrooms are good, but are again up to 50 cents per pound.

Notwithstanding the fact that the receipts in October, 1907, were very much lower than what they were this year, the salaries were more than \$1000 in excess of what the county is now paying. In October, 1901, \$2326.01 was paid for salaries, and \$219.05 for supplies, making a total of \$3545.06. In the same month in 1906 the total expenditure was \$2293.97, which being paid out for salaries and \$153.01 for supplies. Last month only \$2545.87 was expended by the county, \$213.97 for supplies, and \$2331.90 for salaries.
