JAPANESE CELEBRATE IN Y. M. C. A. AUDITORIUM.

British Consul Laidlaw and Americans Join in Paying Honor to Japan's Ruler.

The birthday of Mutsn Hito, Emperor of Japan, was celebrated last night at the Y. M. C. A. at a grand rally, at which addresses were delivered by which addresses were delivered by resident and visiting Japanese and the British Consul, James Laidlaw. The Emperor was born November 3, 1846, and ascended the throne February 13, 1867. He is the one hundred and twenty-second ruler of his dynasty, which has reigned in an unbroken line for

2567 years. Mr. Laidlaw, in his address, deplored

Americans. He paid a high tribute to the statesmanship of the present Emperor, under whose rule Japan has achieved its phenomenal growth.

A unique feature of the exercises was the reading of the imperial edict by T. Alba, Japanese Vice-Consul. During the singing of the National anthem, which preceded the reading of the edict, the imperial flag, which hung in the rear of the platform, was drawn in the rear of the platform, was drawn aside, showing a portrait of the Emperer. The entire audience then sa-

inted the pertrait, when it was again covered by the flag.
