PASTOR IS ROBBED

Methodist Parsonage Looted for Fourth Time.

BURGLARS SECURE LITTLE

Grace Church Manse Object of Attack by Persistent Thieves Who Steal While Minister Prays.

While Rev. W. H. Heppie, pastor of the Grace Methodist Church, and the members of his family were attending church services last night and the pastor was discoursing on the purification of soul life, speaking from the text, "A Pressing American Need," burglars entered and ransacked the parsonage at 445 Taylor street. The burglary was discovered when the family returned home, but so far as could be discovered the only article of value missing was a bracelet, the property of Mrs. Heppie. Its companion, fortunately, was being worn by the daughter, Miss Ruth. While every room was visited and the contents of numerous drawers inspected, the robbers did not find the strong box in which the pastor keeps his money and valuable papers. The thieves entered the residence by the side door by breaking the glass which enabled them to release the two locks by which the door was barred. This is the fourth time in as many years that the parsonage of Grace Church has been broken into. Three times in the same number of years while Rev. REVIEW TOWNSEND REPORT

BONAPARTE WILL LOOK INTO LAND-GRANT MATTER.

Suit in Equity Will Be Instituted if Report Meets With Attorney-General's Favor.

Nov. 24.—Attorney-General Bonaparte will have an extended conference tomorrow afternoon with his

special assistants, Townsend and McBlair, with reference to their investigation of Oregon & California land grants in Oregon, and will go over in detail their joint report, which has been completed and is ready for departmental action.

T. C. Becker, of Buffalo, who has been selected to conduct this case in court, when the bill has been framed, will also be present. No details of Townsend's report are now obtainable and it is probable no information regarding his findings will be made public until after the same has been examined by the Attorney-General. If the department approves the recommendations made by Townsend, it is understood a bill in equity will be prepared and institution of a suit will then be entrusted to Becker, though pressure is being brought to bear to have Townsend commissioned to conduct the prosecution of the case, inasmuch as he is more familiar with the facts than any one else. Townsend had a brief conference with Bonaparte yesterday, but dis-
