BOTH BOATS ARE DAMAGED

ASTORIA, Or., Jan. 3.—(Special.)—The British ship Port Patrick, which sailed from this port this morning for the United Kingdom, collided with the Columbia River lightship shortly before noon, and both vessels were damaged.
