

SOCIALIST MOB INVADES BERLIN

Demands Manhood Suffrage in Prussia and Hisses the Chancellor.

POLICE REPULSE PEOPLE

Great Demonstration Before Parliament Falls to Move Von Buelow, Who Opposes Giving Workmen Their Real Representation.

BERLIN, Jan. 10.—The Socialists today organized a demonstration before the building of the Prussian Landtag, in which a radical resolution demanding universal suffrage in Prussian elections was to come up for discussion.

Police Drive Back Crowds

The excitement reached the highest pitch when a detachment of mounted police wheeled around the corner from Wilhelmstrasse and approached the Landtag at a brisk trot.

Mob Gathers Before Palace

A large number of the demonstrators then marched to the office of the Vorwaerts to procure copies of extra editions of the newspaper.

Chancellor Opposes Reform

Various speeches were made in the Landtag on the question at issue, but at the close of the session Prince von Buelow, the Imperial Chancellor, declared that manhood suffrage as it existed in Reichstag would not be for the good of the state.
