THINK THEY HAVE THIEF

POLICE REGARD K. KALOWICH AS BAD MAN.

Believed That Sensational Capture Will Break Up Band of Burglars.

In the arrest of K. Kalowich at First and Flinders streets after a hot chase by Patrolmen Charles Tennant and James Hunter at 3 o'clock yesterday morning, the police believe they have captured one of a gang of sneak-thieves and burglars who have been committing depredations in the city during the past several weeks.

Kalowich, in company of three others, was seen at the corner of Second and Burnside streets by the officers, who inquired as to their business on the streets at that hour. On the approach of the uniformed officers, the quartet dispersed and fled in different directions. Two of them—Kalowich and another, whose name he refused to give—ran toward Front street, hotly pursued by the officers.

On reaching Front street the two men turned north, and on rounding the corner the officers caught sight of but one man, the other having disappeared in the fog. Calling upon the fleeing man to halt, both officers announced they would shoot, but at that juncture a colored man, proprietor of a fruit stand on Front street, accompanied by his wife, stepped out on the sidewalk and the vigilant slouches replaced their armament and sprinted. Seeing that the officers were gaining on him, Kalowich commenced throwing a way portions of his burden, which proved to be pairs of new shoes and rubbers.

Kalowich was run to earth in the cellar of a deserted building at Front and Flinders streets. When covered by the guns of the officers, Kalowich was in the act of disposing of a .22-caliber revolver, which he attempted to hide behind a pile of rubbish. In the bundle he was carrying at the time he was spotted by the officers was found 11 pairs of new shoes, several pairs of rubbers and other articles which lead the police to believe that

REMOVE DIVORCE CAUSE

LICENSES TO BE REFUSED TO PERSONS UNDER 18.

County Clerks of Idaho Counties Get Together and Take Step That Brings Consternation.

LEWISTON, Idaho, Jan. 12.—(Special.)—Consternation was caused among certain classes in Lewiston yesterday, when County Attorney Needham issued orders to Auditor Gifford to issue no more marriage licenses to contracting parties under 18 years of age. It has been the rule at the Auditor's office heretofore to issue the licenses to any couple. If their ages were beneath 18 and the youngsters had secured the consent of their parents for the union, no further questions were asked.

The move is the result of a conference of County Attorneys from Latah, Ada, Nez Perce, Canyon and Washington Counties, held in Lewiston recently. Scores of divorce cases have been the result of unions between lovers too young to know their minds, later tiring of each other.

Leabo Not "Whitewashed."

PORTLAND, Or., Jan. 12.—(To the Editor.)—We, the undersigned, emphatically deny all published statements in the local press to the effect that the executive board of the Oregon State Federation of Labor did in any manner "whitewash" ex-Secretary T. M. Leabo in expiating him from the stigma cast upon him by the report of the committee on officers' reports at the 8th annual convention of the Oregon State Federation of Labor. The facts are that the newly-elected secretary, J. F. Cassidy, demanded that the books, accounts and report of ex-Secretary Leabo be completely audited by the board and if found correct, a statement given him to that effect. The entire board, being present, acquiesced in the proposal and voluntarily signed the statement that the books, accounts and report are correct and above criticism. President C. H. Gram was not present at the auditing of the books and accounts, but signed the statement on the authority of his executive board.

CAMP WITH REGULARS

Militia to Go to American Lake From Three States.

SEATTLE, Wash., Jan. 12.—(Special.)—According to a telegram received today by Colonel Lamping, N. G. W., from Adjutant-General Hamilton, in Washington, D. C., there will be no artillery camp for the State Guard this Summer, but the Guard, with Oregon and Idaho, will go into encampment with the regulars of these states at American Lake.

The message was sent after a conference between the Adjutants-General of Oregon, Washington, Idaho and the War Department officials. This indicates the Government has abandoned its experiment to constitute the National Guard organizations of Coast States, supplementary to Coast Artillery, and that the militia already organized will preserve its present status.
