Suggests Merchants Unite to Secure Stock Quotations and Facilitate Sales.

MONTHLY MEETING HELD

Plans for the establishment of a commercial exchange in Portland are under consideration by the members of the Board of Trade. At the regular monthly meeting of the organization last night, the project was discussed fully and a better understanding was reached by the members in regard to the proposed changes.

How Exchange Would Work.

In the new quarters, he said, merchants could come between 11 A. M. and 1 P. M. to the exchange rooms, where they could arrive at an understanding in regard to the day's quotations on all commodities.

Adjust Business Disputes. The Board of Trade should facilitate the speedy adjustment of business disputes through the medium of a board of arbitration and a board of appeal, which boards should be promptly and conscientiously organized.
