

SUITER TO MAKE FIGHT FOR LIBERTY

His Trial for the Killing of Henry Shaffer Promises a Legal Battle.

BOTH SIDES DETERMINED

Longshoremen's Union to Aid Prosecution—Suitor Wants to Hold Off Trial Until After the June Election.

Patrolman Nathan Suttler, who killed Henry Shaffer last Sunday, is negotiating for the services of Attorney John M. Logan and Dan J. Mahoney to defend him at his forthcoming trial on the charge of second degree murder.

The prosecution, on the other hand, will be waged in earnest and special prosecutors are the City Attorney, the Longshoremen's Union and by German people who are interested in the case because of Shaffer's nationality.

Suttler complains that political considerations are playing a considerable role in his summary treatment. When taken to the Municipal Court yesterday forenoon to testify against the seven men arrested for disorderly conduct at the time of the killing, Shaffer said it was only a waiting time, since it was a foregone conclusion that the accused men would be dismissed in the face of public sentiment over the killing.
