

# COLEMAN'S IN PORTLAND MARKETS

THERE are signs of Spring in the markets as well as in the millinery stores. Asparagus made its appearance during the past week, costing, however, from 25 to 60 cents a pound. New potatoes are also to be seen, at three pounds for 25 cents, and blanched dandelion, for salads or to be served as a cooked vegetable, at 15 cents a pound. Dandelion is both wholesome and appetizing when properly treated. But although the cultivated kind are much superior to the persistent plague of our lawns, the latter if caught young and blanched like chicory or endive is very good, alone or combined with lettuce according to taste, and can easily be had "free of charge."

"Turnips are now coming with fine green tops that are often wasted by the woman who would spend many dollars for far less effective complexion beautifiers. ## CONFISCATES PROPERTY. MRS. WHITNEY'S VERSION

Argues That Single-Tax Proposal Is Worse Than Socialism.

PORTLAND, March 5.—(To the Editor.)—That the single tax receives support in certain quarters, and that it receives it in others, may be due to a misunderstanding as to what the measure really stands for.

Every one knows that the single tax is a tax upon land to the exclusion of other forms of property, but this is very far from being all that it represents. The tax on land is only a means to an end. The theory of the single tax is that all land should be owned in common—should be the property of the community. Private ownership of land is denounced, and all the evils and shortcomings of modern civilization, whether social, economic or political, are traced to such private ownership. It is proposed to remedy these evils by imposing so heavy a tax upon land that private ownership will cease to be profitable. Private rents are to be taxed out of existence. The idea is, in brief, to confiscate the land of the individual owners for the benefit of the public. This single tax is a confiscatory measure.

It is sometimes asked if the single tax is not Socialistic in nature. It is something worse than Socialism. The economic principles of Socialism are, as generally understood, the ownership of all property in common, and in order to bring this about, the confiscation of all forms of property for the benefit of the community. The single tax, upon the other hand, believe in the public ownership of but one form of property—land, and urge the confiscation of land for the benefit of those who either have no property at all, or have it in other forms. True Socialism means equal treatment for all. The single tax means the shifting of the burden of all to the shoulders of a particular class.

## HOOD RIVER FLOAT DESIGN. HEARS REPORT ON WRECK

Model Accepted for Representation in Rose Festival Parade.

Designs were accepted and contract signed for a mammoth floral float to represent Hood River in the All-Oregon parade of the June Rose Festival yesterday. Final arrangements were consummated between Hood River business men and the executive committee of the Festival, and the float-builders will begin at once upon the design selected. The Hood River float will come in the neighborhood of 1900 and will be symbolic of the principal industries of the fertile valley. The chief feature of the piece will be a big red apple, upon which the queen will have her throne. Surrounding the apple and half submerging the huge golden cornucopia which is also a part of the superstructure of the float, are the massive clusters of rich, luscious Hood River strawberries, while out of the cornucopia will pour all the varied products of the district.

Besides the queen, nearly a score of young girls, draped in appropriate costume, will ride on the picturesque float, and these human pictures will be selected by a voting contest which will soon be inaugurated at Hood River. A 60-piece band, the largest local aggregation of musicians ever gathered together, has been donated to the Festival to take part in the parade to precede the big benefit performance to be held at the Marquam Grand Theater next Friday afternoon. This donation is by the local Musicians' Union, which will also furnish a largely augmented orchestra for the show itself.

## FOR U. OF O. APPROPRIATION. Portland Commercial Club Passes Resolution Indorsing Bill.

As an indorsement of the movement among the various commercial bodies of the city in support of the increased appropriation for the State University at Eugene, at its last meeting the following resolution was passed by the Portland Commercial Club:

Whereas, The work of the University of Oregon cannot reach its highest efficiency without adequate funds; be it

Resolved, By the Portland Commercial Club that it is the sentiment of this body that appropriations should be made for the maintenance of the University of Oregon commensurate with the needs of that institution, and that every other action should be favored which will enable it to keep pace with the rapid development of the state in other regards, and make every Oregonian proud of the University.
