SILVER TROWEL DUE HERE

MASSONIC EMBLEM GOING AROUND THE WORLD.
Expected to Reach This City From Pocatello Soon—Lodges Will Celebrate Arrival.

GERMAN ALLIANCE HINTED

Reported King Manuel Will Wed German Princess.

TALK TO 3000 FARMERS

"LECTURE TRAIN" MAKES BIG HIT IN PALOUSE.
Wheatgrowers Ask Many Questions, and Other Demonstrations Have Been Decided Upon.

GERMAN ALLIANCE HINTED

LISBON, March 6.—The report that Emperor William of Germany will visit Lisbon this Spring, started the rumor here that arrangements were being made for the marriage of King Manuel and Princess Victoria, only daughter of the Emperor.

W. B. Mackenzie is a member of the committee that has been appointed by Willamette Lodge, A. F. and M., of this city, to receive the Masonic trowel of silver, which is on its way around the world and which is expected to reach this city in a few days. While arrangements have not been completed, the receipt of the trowel will probably be the occasion for an elaborate celebration. The trowel was started from New York City and when last heard from was in the hands of the Pocatello, Idaho, lodge. The trowel will go to every Masonic jurisdiction in Christendom before it completes its long journey. Its mission is to establish a closer relationship between all of the Masonic lodges of the world. It was started on its journey two years ago from the New York jurisdiction. On its tour thus far, the trowel has visited New York, Rochester, Buffalo, Hamilton, Ontario, Detroit, Toledo, Elkhart, Chi-

ago, Cedar Rapids, Omaha, Denver and Cheyenne. From Cheyenne, it was sent to Salt Lake City and thence to Pocatello, from which point it will be delivered to the Portland lodge. The trowel was consecrated and dedicated by the grand lodge of New York on October 30, 1906. It was first conveyed to Rochester and delivered to Geneva Falls Lodge, thence it went to Hornville Lodge, thence to Washington Lodge of Buffalo. It was then sent across the border to Hamilton, Ontario, where it was received by Barton Lodge with elaborate ceremonies.

SPOKANE, Wash., March 6.—(Special.)—Lectures, on the two days' trip of the wheat demonstration train of the O. R. & N. and Washington State College, which closed tonight at Colfax, talked to almost 3000 at 14 different points in Whitman County, and all of those who listened to the lectures, viewed the exhibits from the State College farm and asked many questions concerning them. Many requests for seed-corn and seeds of other crops, advocated as profitable to be raised on Summer fallow land were received, filed and the seeds will be sent to the farmers requesting them. Many new names were added to the already large mailing list, and requests for college bulletins will be filled by the station staff. So great has the success of this train

been, and so important the results shown, that other trains will follow. Interest in the project has been awakened everywhere, and requests for demonstration trains are already pouring in from a large territory. General Freight Agent Miller received a request from the Pendleton Chamber of Commerce. The train today drew crowds at LaCrosse, Hooper, Winona, Endicott and Diamonds. At Endicott, Y. C. Mansfield, a farmer, complained that he had been discriminated against in the shipping of potatoes and grain from Endicott and at first was very severe in his arraignment of the railroad. General Agent Miller made a conciliatory speech, in which he urged Mansfield and any other man who had a grievance to come direct to headquarters of the railroad and not stand on the street and howl his grievance to whoever would listen. Haverman Awarded \$150 Damages. CATHLAMET, Wash., March 6.—Superior Court, after being in session for eight days, Judge A. E. Rice presiding, has just adjourned, Judge Rice being fortunate in clearing the docket this term. Some of the cases had been on record for several years. One of the most important suits tried at this term was that of Henry Haverman vs. Charles W. Flanders, sheriff of this county, for \$3000. The plaintiff was represented by John Ditchburn, of

Portland, and Frank Olson, prosecuting attorney of Wahkiakum County. The defendant was represented by Judge N. H. Bloomfield, a former judge of this county, and Mr. Scelling, of Cathlamet. The jury awarded \$150 and costs.
