**SAVES BOY FROM DROWNING**

**GUS PETERSON IN LINE FOR A CARNEGIE MEDAL.**

**Rescues Louis Ancelina, 16 Years Old, From Death in Willamette River.**

Louis Ancelina, an Italian boy, aged 16 years, who resides with his parents at 123 Caruthers street, was saved from drowning in the Willamette River at 5:30 o'clock last night through the presence of mind and heroism of Gus Peterson, a deckhand on the tug Samson, who leaped overboard and caught the little fellow as he was sinking for the third time and carried him safely to shore. The boy had been playing on the dock at the foot of Jefferson street, alongside which structure the tug was moored, and in some manner lost his footing and tumbled headlong into the river. The crew of the tugboat, which was about to take out a string of barges, saw the boy fall from the dock platform, which is nearly 30 feet above the water level, and Peterson leaped into the water fully clad and wearing rubber top-boots. The rescuer was forced to swim 40 yards before reaching the drowning youth and succeeded in grasping the youngster just as he was going down for the third time. The lifesaver then turned about and struggled manfully to regain the pontoon moored alongside the tug, which he eventually gained, with his burden, in an almost exhausted condition. Willing hands assisted the rescuer and rescued to a place of safety, and to many it appeared that Peterson's efforts had been in vain, for the boy, since the lifeless, but Dan Kern, president of the Columbia Contract Company, which concerns controls the tug Samson, attempted to resuscitate the tug Samson, attempted the vigorous efforts of Mr. Kern the boy soon commenced to show signs of life, whereupon an ambulance was summoned and the lad was conveyed to St. Vincent's Hospital, where Dr. H. G. Parker found that the only serious effects of the accident were a number of severe bruises from the fall. A number of persons who witnessed the heroic rescue have announced their intention of sending Peterson's name to the Andrew Carnegie committee, which body recognizes acts of heroism by the presentation of a medal of honor.

**OLD WRECK IS UNCOVERED**

**HULL OF CLARA NEVADA IS EXPOSED IN ALASKA SANDS.**

**Eleven-Year Mystery Cleared by a Lighthouse-Keeper--Search to Be Made for Cargo of Gold.**

SEATTLE, March 12--A special cable to the Times from Juneau, Alaska, says James Currie, keeper of the lighthouse at Eldridge Rock, brings news of the finding of the wreck of the Clara Nevada, which was lost in 1897, with 65 passengers on board. The pursuer was the only one ever found. The exact location of the Nevada's hull has been a mystery these 11 years, until the terrific winds of the last few days exposed the remains of the craft to view. Many human bones have been picked up on the beach in this vicinity. The Nevada is believed to have had a large amount of gold dust on board, as several Klondikers were on the way out with

**their first clean-ups. Parties here are preparing to search for her treasure.**

**CHECK FOUND WORTHLESS**

**J. H. Johnson, a Lawyer, Arrested for Passing Bad Paper.**

J. H. Johnson, a lawyer well known in Police Court circles, was arrested last night by Detective Sergeant Baty, charged with obtaining money under false pretenses. The complainant is Gong Wo, proprietor of a Chinese restaurant on Seventh street, between Alder and Morrison, who asserts that after having obtained several meals on credit, Johnson tendered a bad \$5 check on the German-American Bank in payment, and received \$2 in change. The check was returned from the bank marked "no funds," whereupon the Chinese swore out a warrant for Johnson's arrest. Johnson at first told Sergeant Baty that he had made a miscalculation, and had thought that he had the money in the bank at the time to meet payment for the check, but later admitted there were several more checks which had been issued like the one given to the Chinese, and which were likely to be heard from.
