

FAVOR REPUBLICAN CHOICE

HODSON PEOPLE AGREE TO PLEDGE THEMSELVES.

Men Nominated for Legislature. Hold Meeting and Resolve Upon Action—Statement People Busy.

An agreement was reached yesterday between members of the Hodson-Sichel-Bayer ticket to pledge themselves to the nominee of the Republican primaries for United States Senator. The first pledge of this ticket was to support the "people's choice" of the primary.

This lead was followed yesterday by other members of the ticket, at a meeting held in the afternoon. The effect has been to pacify to some extent the Idlemann-Davis-Drake-Colwell camp, which has been advocating "Republican voters' choice" doctrine.

"We demanded of the Hodson crowd," said one of the Idlemann camp, "only that they stand on the county convention platform and promise to vote for the Republican voters' choice for United States Senator. Since they have made a flip-flop in that direction, I don't know that we desire to continue the row."

The statement No. 1 camp was somewhat busy yesterday, Thomas McCusker being the especially active patriot. Dan Kellner, who has come out as a candidate for the State Senate on a Statement-No. 1 pledge, is counted as one of the stalwarts of this camp.
