TORRENS LAW GOOD

Sustained by Supreme Court of Colorado. OF INTEREST IN OREGON Robert C. Wright Discusses Ruling and Its Application to System That Has Been Adopted in This State. H. B. LITT 351 WASHINGTON ST. The constitutionality of the Torrens land law was sustained recently by the State Supreme Court of Colorado. Discussing the importance of the decision, as relating to a similar law in this state, where considerable land has been registered under the act, Robert C. Wright, a Portland lawyer, yesterday said: As the title to a large amount of valuable property has already been registered under the Torrens law, it will be of much interest to those persons throughout the state who have already taken advantage of the law, or who intend to do so, to learn of the latest decision of a Supreme Court in regard to the constitutionality of the law.

Similar Law in Oregon. The last point decided was upon the objection that the auditor and County Clerk should be registrars, created a new office, that of Registrar of Titles, which was neither elected nor by election. The court held that this part of the act dealt wholly with the duties to be performed by a certain officer who was already Recorder of Deeds and had charge of records of the county, and that the Legislature had a right to add to or take away those duties as it saw fit. That in calling the Clerk Registrar of Titles, and placing an equitable proceeding in the court, it was in no way creating a new office.
