Among the new vegetables this week are string beans at 25 cents a pound; sorrel, at 6 cents a bunch; and more mushrooms at 25 cents a pound. Everyone knows how to use string beans, but some appear to be unfamiliar with sorrel. This makes good cream soup, is nice in salad, and excellent when cooked as a puree, like spinach—especially when served with roast lamb or lamb cutlets. Morels have their devoted admirers in spite of their somewhat unattractive honeycombed appearance. I know of one well-meaning housekeeper who, unacquainted with this variety of mushroom, sternly reproved a market-man for exposing such "worm-eaten things" for sale, and threatened to "report" him. Morels are good either stewed or saute, as well as being a useful flavoring for sauces.
There is a tradition that Nero's amiable mother, Agrippina, used a dish of morels as a vehicle for the poison which removed her husband, Claudius, and cleared the way to the throne for her son and that, thereafter, Nero, with his remarkable sense of humor, always referred to this preparation as "the dish of the gods." This name is still given to morels by some epicures.
Asparagus is very good this week and ranges in price from 10 to 20 cents a pound. I saw some very nice mustard greens, two bunches for 5 cents, as well as dandelion, cabbage greens, spinach, chervil, watercress and brussels sprouts. Head lettuce is getting cheaper and better in quality. Peas are 10 to 15 cents a pound. Hothouse cucumbers cost 15 to 20 cents and tomatoes 20 cents a pound. Peppers come 3 for 25 cents and eggplant 35 cents a pound.
There are good black radishes, and crisp pink Oregon radishes. Celery, colery and cauliflower are still good, but artichokes are less inviting than they were. Nice little new potatoes come at 2 or 3 pounds for 25 cents. I like the very smallest ones, "English style"—bottled with a sprig of fresh mint and simply served with a dressing of good fresh butter.
Strawberries are to be had at 25 and 50 cents a box. Rubarb is cheaper than it

was last week. The fruit market is not a particularly interesting field just at present, but we know there are plenty of good things coming.
Frog-legs are in again at 25 cents a dozen. Crawfish are also to be seen at 50 cents a dozen, ready cooked. Snad is more plentiful this week, costing 10 to 15 cents a pound. Perch, at 10 cents a pound, is also plentiful, and the larger ones, stuffed and roasted, are very acceptable

with a simple caper and chopped pickle sauce. There was good halibut at 15¢ cents and salmon at 15 and 20 cents. Flounder, sole, catfish, striped bass, mackerel, rock cod and smelt complete the list, together with crabs, shrimps and clams.

For poultry, the prices average as follows: Turkey, 25 cents; hens, 30 cents; broilers, 35 to 40 cents; ducks, 25 cents a pound; geese, 30 cents a pound, and squabs 75 cents a pair.
