**PARSONS IS AGAIN MISSING**

FEAR FELT FOR DEMENTED SPOKANE BROKER.

Took Streetcar Saturday and Has Not Since Been Seen—Recently Lost on the Heights.

Following under mental strain, incident on by overwork, C. F. Parsons, a well-known Spokane real estate dealer, who has been in Portland for several weeks, disappeared from his wife and friends Saturday afternoon and has not since been heard from. When last seen Mr. Parsons boarded a Morrison-street car and it is feared that he may have been wandering in the hills west of the city. As his mind had been slightly unbalanced for some time his friends entertain the still greater fear that he may have taken his own life.

About ten days ago Mr. Parsons suddenly left his wife while they were eating in a local restaurant, and was later found, wandering aimlessly at Portland Heights. He was sent to a private sanitarium but for several days has been at the home of a friend, H. L. Long, 687 Hoyt street. His health appeared to be greatly improving and Saturday Mr. Parsons went for a walk with his wife and Mrs. Long. Leaving the women without any explanation, he boarded a streetcar and has not since been seen.

Mr. Parsons is 34 years old and is 5 feet 4 inches in height. He has gray hair and mustache and Saturday wore a black suit, tie, and derby hat. He is a Mason of high standing and prominent in Spokane business circles. A reward for his return has been offered by his friend, Mr. Long.

**RESCUE OF OUTLAW FEARED**

CAPTURED KENT HIGHWAYMEN TAKEN TO SEATTLE.

Confesses to Being One of Five Who Killed Marshal Miller—Blood-hounds Chasing Companions.

SEATTLE, April 12.—A special to the Post-Intelligencer from North Bend says that the prisoner wounded north of that place yesterday afternoon in a fight with Deputy Sheriff Starwch and Storey has confessed that he was with the four men who shot and killed Marshal Harry Miller at Kent, Thursday night. He is a Montegaria and says his name is Michael Albridge.

Deputy Sheriff McGuire left with him for Seattle in an automobile to-night. The North Bend authorities, fearing that the Montegarias who work on the railroad camps might make an attempt to rescue him.

Deputy Sheriff Storey, who was wounded in last night's fight, is not seriously hurt and will be brought to Seattle tomorrow. The three men who escaped after the fight have gone north. One of them was wounded in the side and left a trail of blood, which the posse picked up this morning and renewed the chase, dividing north of here and sending bloodhounds on the scent. Deputy Sheriff Storey, who has a wound in the right thigh, says he and Starwch fought in the open, while the highwaymen hid behind tree stumps.

**KINDERGARTEN PLAN RESTS**

Effort to Introduce System Into the Public Schools Is Postponed.

PORTLAND, April 11.—(To the Editor.)—The Free Kindergarten Association met this week and decided to postpone further action for the present for the introduction of kindergartens into the public schools of the city. The stringency of the times, the introduction of industrial training, new schoolhouses for the rapidly increasing population, and the extra expense for fire safeguards in all school buildings were the direct causes for the postponement.

The movement for the incorporation of kindergartens into the public school system is growing throughout the United States. Portland will certainly not be left behind in this forward movement.

The children of our large foreign population require just such an opportunity to acquire the rudiments of our spoken language before entering the first grade of our public schools. With English at 4 years of age, true American assimilation will be effected much more speedily and completely.

There are now many private and charitable kindergartens maintained in the city and these whose little ones attend will never give up the hope that the advantages they enjoy may be extended to many, many more in the near future.

The kindergarten is the bulwark of industrial training and is the foundation of the better education demanded for the 20th century.

**EAST SIDE STREET WORK**

Improvements Soon to Be Made Throughout Extensive District.

Many important street improvements are to be projected throughout the East Side. Ellsworth street is to be paved with crushed rock from East Twenty-sixth to Habersham, at a cost of \$18,250. This street lies in the Waverly-Bismont district. In Multnomah Addition, Highland avenue will be improved with crushed rock between Central, Albina and Skidmore, at a cost of over \$10,000. Gantonben avenue, in the same addition, will be paved with crushed rock at a cost of \$14,000, and Michigan avenue will be improved at a cost of \$10,000.

Williams avenue is to be paved with hard surface material from Alberta street to Killingsworth avenue, at a cost of \$16,500. East First will be paved from Holladay avenue to the south line of block 57, Holladay Addition, at a cost of \$11,372. Minnesota avenue will be paved with crushed rock between Fremont and Skidmore streets, at a cost of \$10,825. Montans avenue will be improved with crushed rock between the same streets at a cost of \$9,420. The street improvements in Multnomah Addition, under way and projected, will cost upwards of \$100,000, the intention being to pave every street in that section.
